

Course Descrition The course aims to help you to understand the world from data. Specifically, you will learn how to incorporate

the statistical thinking into your daily life, gather the data, analyze and interpret the data. The course covers descriptive and graphic summaries of the data, basic probability and distributions, and statistical inference. Interesting examples will be discussed to show how statistical methods are applied in various fields, and decisions are made based on the analysis results. In the big data era, to enable scalable data analysis, statistical computing is now emphasized more than ever. The R software will be intensively used to conduct statistical analysis.

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Geospatial Information Sciences and Geostatistics

Course Descrition

The course is an introductory course for general majors to get familiar with Geographic Information Systems and web-based GIS. It combines lectures with a substantial practical component, The lectures cover the nature of geospatial data, spatial data models, technical issues in GIS data acquisition, data storage and retrieval, data visualization, and web-GIS. Half of the lectures will deal with training in real-world data using the open-source GIS software(QGIS). The practical component will give students hands-on experience in using proprietary GIS software packages to handle geospatial information.
